OBJECTIVE 1

ACTION PLAN

The Student Activities Department will provide leisure and recreational activities for all students, and will increase the number weekend activities one per month over the previous year. The number of intramural sports will increase by one each year until there are four a semester. The Student Government Association will participate in planning activities for the campus and be a liaison between the students and Student Activities regarding activities on campus.

ASSESSMENT

The Director of Student Activities will keep a log of the number of participants and activities per month. An intramural sports survey will be given for student interest, and a record of the number of participants and intramural sports will be logged. The Student Government Association will complete a survey regarding student population suggestions and insights.

RESULTS & RESPONSES—2002-03

OBJECTIVE 1

The Student Activities Department will provide student services through activities that improve campus life and student development

RESULTS

The Student Activities Office planned and conducted ten campus-wide events during the year. Participation logs for each event recorded an attendance range from a low of 17 to a high of 312. The specific events were:

Student evaluation surveys for intramural sports indicated a satisfaction rating of 4.43 on a scale from 1 (low) to 6 (high). Student evaluations for other student insights and suggestions were incorporated into the campus-wide survey distributed campus-wide. The survey was completed by 124 students.

RESPONSE

The campus activities will be altered in the coming year to allow for greater participation among commuting students, and the intramural program will add at least two sports to the schedule in order to increase participation.

In response to student surveys, the Student Government Association will sponsor a weekly activities newsletter for all students, develop a SGA office location accessible to students, and explore the option of launching a SGA web page through which ideas and suggestions can be made.

RESULTS & RESPONSES — 2002-03

OBJECTIVE 2

The Student Activities Department will provide student services that enhance the Christian environment on campus.

RESULTS

The annual campus survey distributed during the Spring Semester to students indicated a satisfaction rating of 4.24 on a scale of 1 (low) to 6 (high) concerning students' views of the Christian values demonstrated and offered through student activities.

RESPONSE

In an effort to raise students' satisfaction for the integration of Christian values on campus, the Student Government Association will form a Spiritual Life Committee to evaluate and implement events that enhance Christian values through campus activities.

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RESULTS & RESPONSES—2003-04

OBJECTIVE 2

The Student Activities Department will provide student services that enhance the Christian environment on campus.

RESULTS

SGA has worked with the Director of Student Activities to plan activities and encourage students to participate. The SGA “Student Life Committee” provided insight to the BPC administration from the campus population. Results from this committee and the SGA are as follows:

- Visitation changes for the 2004-2005 year. This change came as a result of the SGA conducting student surveys and keeping a chronology of the current visitation in all the residential halls and how it was not being used wisely. Last year visitation was on Tuesday, Thursday from 6pm until 10pm and Saturday 7pm until 11:00pm and Sunday 2-5pm. New visitation dates and hours will be Thursday 6 to 10pm, Sunday 2 –5pm for all female residence halls. Tuesday 6-10pm and Saturday 7-11pm.
- Overhang at the back door of McAllister
- McAllister Hall bathroom Chest of Drawers from Robinson
- Fence around Baron Ridge
- Computer and printer for the SGA office
- SGA email address for students to visit
- SGA paid for all students to attend the NAIA volleyball playoffs hosted at BPC.
- SGA sponsored the BPC Homecoming events throughout the week.
- Student Activities department added intramural tennis and pin pong tournaments, team handball and pool tournament.

RESPONSE

Student Activities Department will survey students and collaborate with the SGA to plan more activities and make changes on campus that will be positive for all students. The new visitation hours will be used more and they can be monitor better. The SGA will continue to use the Student Development committees that will research certain areas on campus that can improve our student life.

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RESULTS & RESPONSES—2004-05

OBJECTIVE 2

The Student Activities Department will provide student services that enhance the Christian environment on campus.

RESULTS

SGA continues to work with the Director of Student Activities to plan campus activities and be the link for the students to the BPC administration. The SGA was very active in providing insight to some campus changes to the administration. Results were:

- Proposed and established an official “bpc.edu” email address for the SGA.
- Ventilation fan for the stir-fry station in the residential restaurant
- Administration Council agreed to examine the possibility
- Designated Smoking Areas - Administration Council agreed to explore the possibility of designating areas on campus to make campus facilities smoke free
- Cardiovascular Machines
- Dr. Laurie Jossey will look into possible upgrades for the exercise machines in the Cardio rooms.
- Having fish as pets allowed in the residence halls – denied by the Administration
- Lowering the minimum age required for living off campus to 21 or junior status – denied by the Administration
- Installation of “TV Guardian” technology on public televisions on campus – denied
- The redistribution of parking zones – denied
- Installation of Bulletin Board Stations – denied
- Cleaning air vents in Saliba Chapel – denied
- Repair of benches on campus
- SGA sponsored the following events:

RESPONSES

SGA past proposals came to fruition was the paving of the Dowling/Friendship parking lot and privacy fence around the Baron Ridge residence hall. SGA will plan another President’s Forum this upcoming year and continue to work on additional proposals.
