IN TEXT

On Author

Banks (2008) said that there were two kinds of multicultural education paradigms.

In the field of multicultural discourse, two multicultural education paradigms were often discussed (Banks, 2008).

Regarding the two multicultural education paradigms, Banks and Banks (2008) concluded that “these two paradigms have very different assumptions, research findings, and implications for teaching in multicultural classrooms” (p. 53).

Various paradigms have been formulated to explain why low income students and students of color have low levels of academic achievement. The top two major ones are “cultural deprivation paradigm” and “cultural difference paradigm” (Banks, 2008, p. 53).

I was impressed by the two multicultural paradigms in that “these two paradigms have very different assumptions, research findings, and implications for teaching in multicultural classrooms” (Banks & Banks, 2008, p. 53).

On a Book's Title

In his book, *An Introduction to Multicultural Education*, Banks (2008) emphasized the importance of curriculum transformation model rather than curriculum infusion model.

On an Article's Title

The article, "Action Research on Preservice Teachers' Impact on Students' Academic Achievements," received heated criticism in the September issue of *Journal of Teacher Education* this year.

**The same applies to titles of newspaper articles, magazine articles, and website articles.

**References cited in text must appear in the reference list; conversely, each entry in the reference list must be cited in text. The author must make certain that each source referenced appears in both places and that the text citation and reference list entry are identical in spelling and year.

** References cited in text are to be listed alphabetically in the Reference(s) section.
