Pastor Bucky Kennedy. “However, we’re up front from the get-go that our emphasis of camp is spiritual, and the coaches know this. We don’t compromise that. 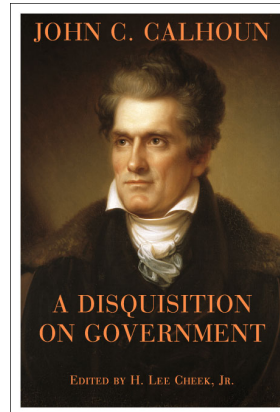

Dr. H. Lee Cheek Jr., one of the country's leading scholars on John C. Calhoun and chair of BPC's Division of Social and Behavioral Sciences, was recently asked to edit and prepare for publication Calhoun's classic, *A Disquisition on Government*, one of the greatest works about the American political system. The book, pictured at right, is scheduled for release in July. Dr. Cheek taught at Brewton-Parker College from 1997-2000, and he rejoined the Brewton-Parker faculty in 2005.
