- The Council viewed renderings of a new stylized Georgia Map and Campus Map from Sarah Long. Her husband is a graduate of Brewton-Parker College and a current adjunct professor.
- The Council reviewed renderings of a new Baron mascot.
- Trustee, Dr. Nancy Stanley, has started a new organization to support Brewton-Parker College called LACE (Ladies for the Advancement of Christian Education).
- The expansion of the BPC internet superhighway (Bandwidth) should be completed over the weekend. The expansion will increase our current two way traffic from two lanes (one each direction) to twenty lanes (ten each direction).
